The Court finds that the probative value exceeds the prejudicial effect under 352 E.C. as to Exhibits 841 and 842.

Rosibel Smith recalled for further examination as a witness on behalf of the People.

Attorneys Zonen and Sanger examined the witness.

In the absence of the Jury with Court, Counsel and Defendant present, trial continued.

Ian Drew sworn and examined as a witness on behalf of the People.

Attorneys Zonen and Mesereau examined the witness and made their arguments to the Court re: the scope of Ian Drew's testimony.

Ian Drew's Attorney, Kelli Sager, present in Court and objects to certain questions asked of Ian Drew under the Shield Law.

Upon stipulation of Counsel for respective parties, the Court reviewed the police reports re: lan Drew's statements.

The Court finds that the probative value of the statement offered by Ian Drew is questionable; that if the statements were introduced, it might somewhat prove the conspiracy, but would prove Konitzer's state of mind and not Jackson's state of mind nor prove Jackson's involvement; that there is real vagueness in Ian Drew's statement as he is not sure of exactly what was said; that under Delaney, the Court does not believe that the Shield Law remains in effect and bars cross examination. The Court orders that the testimony of Ian Drew shall not be allowed.

At 1:35 P.M. in the presence of the Jury with Court, Counsel and Defendant present, trial continued.
